

If you use the Internet you can view/print a listing of U.S. Vessels involved in the Korean War.

Go to: <http://www.usmm.org>

then scroll down to and click on:

" Ship Lists "
(WWII and Murmansk)

When the Lists comes up scroll down to and click on:

"Ships Used in Korean War."

When the Korean War list comes up you will note in the third paragraph a mention of our group of Captains, Chief Engineers and Radio Officers. The names of our 4 ships are also in the listing.

There are almost 700 ships currently listed that participated in the Korean War and the listing is not complete. One ship that is not listed, and should be, is the Kimball R. Smith, the vessel mentioned by Mr. Nottingham in his letter (page 2) to you. I am requesting the keepers of the website to add that vessel to the listing today.

You may already have accessed this listing but I want to be sure you have it.

If, for any reason, you are not able to access this listing I will be glad to print it out and send it to you.

It may also be of interest to you that I am authoring a book entitled "American Civilians in South Korea and Evacuation - 1949/50" A personal documentary. I am targeting for publication before June 2000.
